PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Taylor Quarles, Lighthouse Wind, said that they are making progress with the stipulation process in preparation for the 30-day review process and anticipates being active this summer making information available to the public. His office hours remain consistent.

Richard Pucher, 10643 Lakeshore Road, asked whether or not the Board has plans to add street lights to the intersections of Foss Rd. and Lakeshore Rd. and Marshall Rd. and Lakeshore Rd.

Supervisor Simon referred his question to Councilman Bradley, who was involved with the original street lighting project 5 years ago.

Councilman Bradley responded that the Town has 42 intersections, 22 have been covered. He explained that the Board is in the process of reviewing the last 20 intersections and will be discussing options with Roger Wolfe, Highway Superintendent, for his input because of highway snowplowing.

Paul Lauricella, Town of Yates, said that he had talked to a Yates resident, who sent Paul a graph showing the amounts of energy generated per energy source in New York State. Wind accounted for 1.99% overall. He added that he has always had a problem with the Government subsidizing these projects and blames it on "Junk Science".

Judy Esposito, 10637 Lakeshore Road, asked about the second MET tower and why it was needed and how many MET towers are currently in place in Somerset.

Supervisor Simon explained the Town Moratorium and Tolling Agreement and added that there are 3 MET towers in the Town of Somerset.

Chris Crafts, Town of Yates, gave the Board an update on his shoreline protection progress. He placed 50 tons of rock and 3,000 yards of steel cloth under a DEC permit on his shoreline to help with the erosion and to make it safer. He added that he wished buying rock and steel would make APEX go away.

Linda Fisk, Town of Yates, submitted a handout that compares two legal notices written by the Towns of Yates and Shelby Republican Committees looking for candidates to run in the 2017 election and the disparities between the two notices.

TOWN OFFICERS REMARKS

Dan Wolfe, Code Enforcement Officer, no report.

Tricia Laszewski, Town Assessor, mentioned that Grievance Day was held on May 25th in the Town of Yates and was uneventful.

Roger Wolfe, Highway Superintendent, has been busy doing ditch work, tree trimming, and grading and mowing of roadsides. He added that we have been receiving several water applications to hook into the water system which is common this time of year.

Supervisor Simon mentioned that the Town has a supply of sandbags available to Town of Yates residents at the Town Highway garage and that we have posted a lot of valuable information on the Town website to help answer some questions and keep residents informed. He added that the DHS has been visiting lakefront towns to assess the damage and that grants, with certain stipulations, are available. The Town will probably be applying for grant money due to the damage sustained at the Town Park, and North ends of Marshall, Yates Carlton, and County Line Roads. Lastly, he read a note written by Councilman Riggi explaining that he was out of town on business and does not anticipate other absences and promises to serve the Town to the best of his ability to exceed its potential.
